CALL TO RECONCILIATION

Mark 1:4-11 The Inclusive Bible Karen Tyler-Ruiz

And so John the Baptizer appeared in the desert, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to John and were baptized by him in the Jordan River as they confessed their sins. John was clothed in camel's hair and wore a leather belt around his waist, and he ate nothing but grasshoppers and wild honey. In the course of his preaching, John said, "One more powerful than I is to come after me. I am not fit to stoop and untie his sandal straps. I have baptized you in water, but the One to come will baptize you in the Holy Spirit."

It was then that Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized in the Jordan River by John. RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

ONE: Sisters and Brothers in Christ: Through the Sacrament of Baptism we are initiated into Christ's holy church. We are incorporated into God's mighty acts of salvation and given new birth through water and the Spirit. All this is God's gift, offered to us without price.

ONE: Will you be living witnesses to the gospel, individually and together, wherever you are and in all that you do?

ALL: We will remain faithful members of Christ's holy church and serve as Christ's representatives in the world.

ONE: Let these waters renew in us the resurrection power of Jesus.

ALL: Let these waters make us long for your coming reign.

ONE: Most holy God, Abba!
